Miscellaneous Rumblings... I don't have "one big topic" to talk about, so instead here are a bunch of things... maybe some will be interesting to you???

Glass for the Alfetta - Well, this has been a long time coming! Here in Eugene, there's really only one trusted place for glass installation on special cars - Glass Magnum. Back in March, Mike was all set to come up and do the installation of the front (glued in) and rear (gasketed) screens on the Alfetta. Well, remember that ice storm we had? Mike is contracted to many of the dealerships in Eugene, and frankly, he's been busy repairing windshields since! I finally had the chance, as long as I trailered the car to his shop. So I did, and it's now done! Fun Fact—the Alfetta front/rear glass were both originally glue-in; my hatch and glass in the back was from a GTV6. Fun Fact #2 - the original Alfetta glass had little clips that were forced into the glue

between the glass and the body (let's call them rust-makers!) and then a chrome strip (or, water holder) was clipped onto the clips, providing the trim to cover up the edge of the glass. I didn't want that; I wanted all black. So Mike custom-fabricated an awesome rubber strip around the windscreen.



Looks great and hopefully reduces rust incursion & attack!

<u>Summertime Blues</u> - At the last Board of Directors meeting, we discussed Summertime... well, actually, we discussed driving events during the summertime. It seems the days of Oregon's "relatively mild" summers are gone, as we deal with the same

Alfetta 50th Anniv. Tour to Haugland Collection

September 21 - A Very Special Collection Tour!



Calling all Alfas, and especially the transaxle variety! Alfa Romeo is celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the Alfetta, and by connection, the GTV6 and Milano also. What better way to celebrate than to drive down to Eugene to see the amazing auto collection of Alex and Amy Haugland.

Alex's collection now numbers close to 200, and he recently consolidated them into two warehouses. Alex collects cars that reflect his sense of style, and you will see many "one of one's", as well as beautiful cars from England, Italy, Germany, Spain and more. At last count, Alex has nine Alfas, including a Montreal, a Sprint Special, a SZ, and more, including an Alfetta GT and a GTV6. Best of all, Alex drives his entire collection on a regular basis, and it's not unusual to see he or Amy on the roads around Eugene.

Touring his collection takes time, so the plan will be to arrive at his first warehouse around 10:30. *Meet at the Wilsonville/Baldock Rest Area* (*map HERE*) by 8:30am! Departure is 8:45!! The route down I-5 takes 90 minutes, and down 99W takes 2 hours; we'll make a last minute decision. We'll be at the first building for about 2 hours then caravan the short distance to the other collection location. From there, we will plan a late lunch, probably at "Chiefs BBQ" in Coburg, which is right off I-5.

For those coming on their own or from different locations, we'll post the address of the first warehouse in the September AlfaBits and in the email blasts coming out.

Alex doesn't open his collection to the public, so it's a very special opportunity we have to share his incredible group of cars! Mark those calendars NOW!

"The Haugland Collection is based in Eugene, Oregon, and is a quickly growing, diverse private collection of foreign classic automobiles belonging to Alex and Amy Haugland. The collection consists of over 140 cars from 5 different countries across Europe as well as Japan. The cars range from mass produced entry level cars targeted at the masses to unique low production race cars and luxury automobiles. The goal of this website is to share this collection and the collector's love of the automobile more broadly with the world and give an insight into much of what makes it unique."

In addition to the web site above, Alex and Amy have created a YouTube channel called "Everyday to Exotic" where they take one car and analyze, drive and evaluate it. They have fun with the cars and their discussions are informative and joyful. And the first car they profiled was their 1971 Montreal!


